## Live Oak International Rules & Regulations

### GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Live Oak International Tournament will be conducted according to the current rules of the FEI, the USEF and the Organizing Committee of Live Oak International.

In entering Tournaments at Live Oak International you and your team (trainers, trainers' grooms, family members, agents, etc.) have agreed to honor the General Information as specified in this Prize List and all of the entry form. Your agreement and acceptance of all rules, regulations and Live Oak International decisions, are indicated by completing our Tournament.

### VETERINARY/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

A negative Coggins test is required for every horse entering the tournament grounds (and within 1 year of the start of the tournament). A Health Certificate (issued within 30 days) is required for horses entering State of Florida. FEI entries are required to have the appropriate vaccinations, and consent to as per their discipline.

Each Horse Showing and non-showing must have the attached Statement of Health signed by a licensed veterinarian.

### ARRIVALS

THE STABLES OPEN AT 9:00 AM ON THURSDAY, MARCH 5, 2020. There is a \$500 fee for horses arriving prior to this time unless you have written permission from the organizer. **Please see stabling for early arrival requests.**

### STABLE CREDENTIALS

Credentials for entry to the stable area will be issued as follows: Athlete-1, Partner-1, Trainer-1, Owner up to 2, Parent/Groom for Jumping 1, Four (4) Parent entries - 4, Grooms, Party 3, and Siblings 1. Additional credentials may be purchased for \$500 from Secretary's Office. VIP tickets available for purchase, see form to price list.

### CHECK-IN

Please check in with the Secretary's Office once your horse has arrived - the office opens at 9:00 AM Thursday, March 5, 2020 for stabling and March 6, 2020 for Jumping.

### **CAMPING**

## PRACTICE AREAS & SCHEDULING HOURS

Scheduling is only permitted in designated areas and at designated times. Please obtain a schedule from the Secretary's Office.

## HORSE BRIDLE NUMBERS

1. Horse bridle numbers must be worn by horses at all times including in the exercise and competition areas with the exception of the barn's stall - FEI Article 214.2. Use of the wrong bridle number or not having a bridle number may result in disqualification.
2. Bridle numbers are provided by Live Oak International at the time of Check-in. Competitors are welcome to use their own numbers provided they are easily legible (please see the Competitions Manager if you have concerns about your bridle number).

## TOURNAMENT AREA CONDUCT

1. No persons other than the officials, steward, staff on duty and the judges of the competition may enter the competition ring without the permission of the Competitions Manager or the Organizing Committee.
2. Competitors require formal attire as per FEI and USEF rules. Coaches, trainers and groomers who enter the Competition Ring must be NEAT AND SUITABLY ATTENDED in the opinion of the Hoisting Ring officials. Please see the Competitions Manager for dress code advice. This applies to all course inspections.
3. Spitting Protocol: Spitting is very important in giving the sponsor's full value. You should stay alert to the In Care Person's instructions as when to salute once in the ring.
4. The Organizing Committee has defenses to protest or not protest at any time during the competition.
5. Competitors are only allowed in the Competition Ring when competing or when the course is clearly marked "OPEN".

## PROTESTS

Competitors have accepted favorable and unfavorable rulings in the spirit of good sportsmanship. Feel free to bring your unofficial concerns to our Competitions Manager for consideration. If you insist on making an official protest, it shall be made in writing and delivered to the Tournament Organizer accompanied by a deposit as specified per FEI and USEF rules which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.

## ORGANIZING COMMITTEE DECISIONS

1. IT IS IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THAT INTERPRETATIONS OF EXISTING RULES AND REGULATIONS AND THE INVOKING OF ADDITIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS TO COVER UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES ARE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY OF THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE. ALL OWNERS, TRAINERS, COMPETITORS AND GROOMERS AGREE TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF THESE INTERPRETATIONS AND ADDITIONAL RULINGS BY VIRTUE OF YOUR SIGNED ENTRY.
2. It is the objective of the Organizing Committee to run Live Oak International Tournaments to the highest possible level of sportsmanship. Judges, Course Designers, and Officials have been selected based on their knowledge and experience and their decisions as the competitors are their own responsibility. The Organizing Committee accepts no responsibility for their decisions.
3. The Organizing Committee is not bound by opinions of its staff, such as Veterinary Doctors, Secretary's Office and Field Staff, in the interpretation of these rules.



**EXCUSING OR DISQUALIFYING**

1. Any act of dishonesty or dishonesty to the Judges, Officials or Staff shall at the determination of the Organizing Committee, result in disqualification. Such unacceptable behavior will result in forfeiture of Tournament fees paid and prize money and acceptance in future Tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee.
2. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to remove any groom, trainer, rider, driver, parent, manager or member of all of a related group from the Tournament without being liable for transportation.
3. Unexcused treatment of a horse on the grounds, a violation and if a violation occurs the Organizing Committee has the right to disqualify the competitor from the Tournament. Such unacceptable treatment will result in forfeiture of Tournament fees paid and prize money and acceptance in future Tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee. Refer to Welfare of the Horse, Code of Conduct, FFA-Columbus, FL, Nov 2000.
4. In judging competitions, Judges have the discretion to eliminate a competitor after a sufficient number of penalties have been incurred which prevent the athlete from qualifying for the final placing.
5. In the case of a disqualification of a horse or horses, the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that has been awarded to the disqualified horse(s) and the other prizes will be adjusted accordingly.

**CODE OF CONDUCT**

Live Oak International is committed to the highest standards of behavior. The sports of driving and show jumping expect these same standards, conduct and behavior from its athletes and their associates.

Violation of these standards towards the Live Oak International staff, officials, volunteers, parents, or athletes will not be tolerated and may result in the disqualification of horse and rider. All prize money won and money paid will be forfeited. There will be no appeals on these types of Organizing Committee/Grand Jury decisions.

In the event medical care is required for an individual on Live Oak International property, the medical services on site have been trained and authorized by Live Oak International to provide immediate care and have the authority to make decisions in this capacity, including but not limited to level of care and transportation method to the appropriate treatment facility, should it be deemed necessary.

**NOTE CAREFULLY:** Examples of dress and social behavior on the part of athletes, trainers, owners or associates are not welcome at Live Oak International. At its sole discretion, the Organizing Committee will limit on such individuals leaving the Tournament grounds. Verbal damage of property is strictly prohibited and grounds for expulsion from the facility.

All the people of Live Oak International, our professional staff, officials, technicians, our sponsors, the vendor and our fans are dedicated to you and will make every effort to ensure safe, quality competitions and facilities.

Live Oak International reserves the right to suspend or permanently remove any individual from the grounds for a single egregious act or for violating behaviors that are contrary to the Live Oak International Code of Conduct. **BY ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT YOU ARE ACCEPTING ALL THE RULES AND REGULATIONS INCLUDING THE CODE OF CONDUCT.**




